FEPS FOODBANK COLOUR RUN!

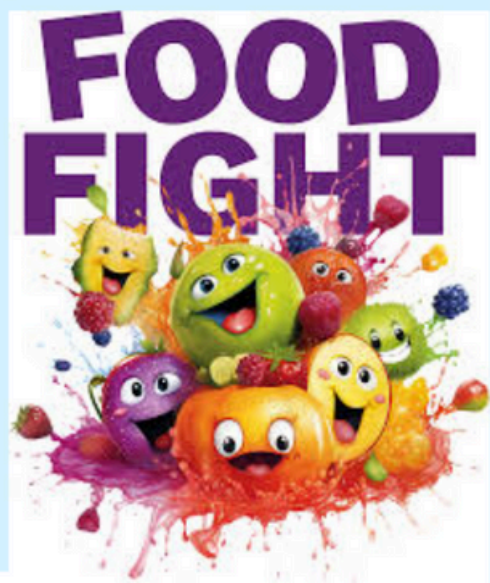
