What is one piece of advice you can give to the students?

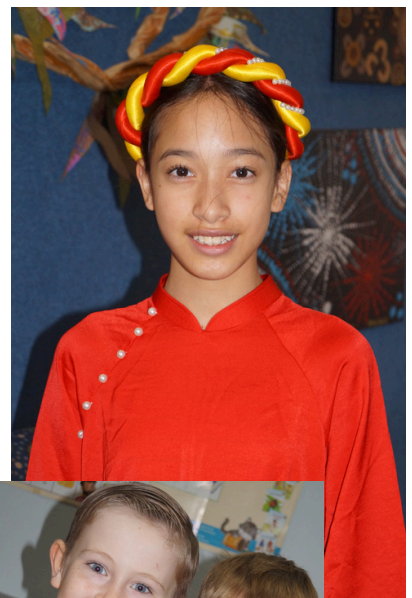
Treat people the way you want to be treated and most importantly show kindness and love as much as you can. I think the world really needs that more than ever at the moment.

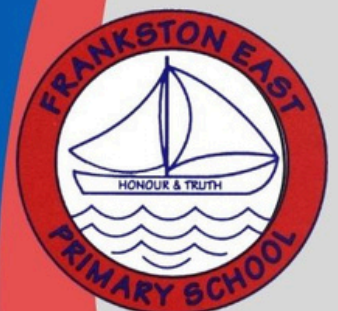

FEPS Veggie Garden



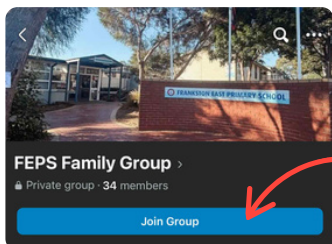
