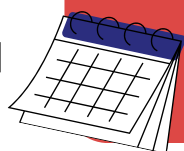
A big congratulations to our August Aussie of the Month Layne from Prep M.

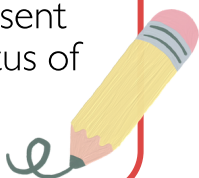

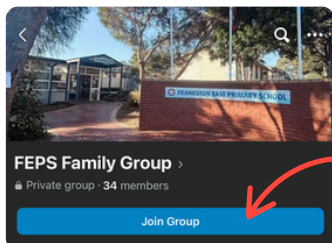
