As always, thank you for your continued support of our school. It is a privilege to work alongside such a wonderful community.

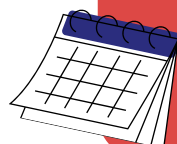

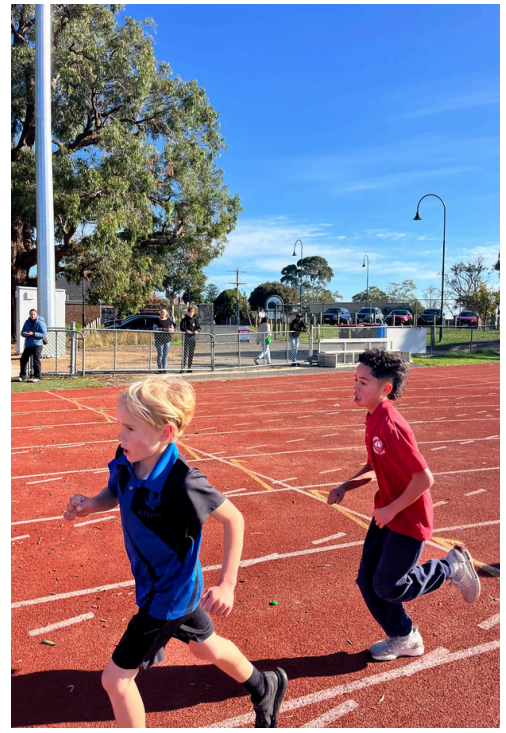

**The one piece of advice I would give the students is to be kind to your teachers, they work really hard!**

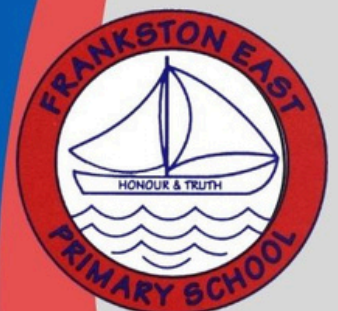

**Book Week Breaky - TBC** - Assist to cook/serve the sausage sizzle at the book week parade (approx 1 hour)

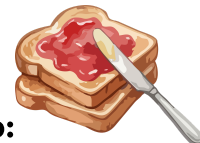
**Fathers Day Stall - Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept** - Help set up stall, help students with their purchases (approx 1 hour)

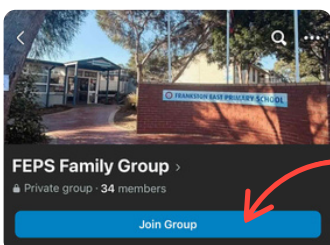
