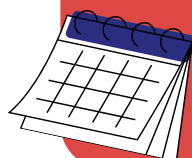

FEAST Info for Parents

Students have been working hard practising their songs as part of the Music curriculum. Attendance at FEAST is an important expectation for all students, and absence will only be approved in extenuating circumstances.

Rehearsal

All children will attend a rehearsal at the theatre on Wednesday 16th of September and will need to return their permission slip and \$5 bus fare. A separate notice has been sent home for this.

Students will need to bring their recess and lunch in a named, disposable bag. No cans or glass bottles please.

Costumes

Students will not need their costumes at rehearsal, these will be given out by classroom teachers upon arrival to the performance or prior. Costumes are not to go home as they are school property, they must be returned upon dismissal of the performance. Please have a change of clothes to change into.

Stage makeup

It is preferable to have students wear foundation, red lipstick and blue eye shadow so that the performers faces can be seen clearly by the audience. This year there is the option for students to have face glitter used as part of their costume, please let your classroom teacher know if your child cannot have this due to allergies/reactions.

Photography

We have been advised by the management of the George Jenkins Theatre that video cameras and photography are prohibited in the theatre. The performance will be recorded and copies will be available.

Evening Arrangements

Parents/Carers will need to bring their children to the George Jenkins theatre at 6:45 pm. Please assist us by leaving the children with the teachers and taking your seat in the theatre when ready. Prior to the performance, students will be supervised by staff and have any additional costume pieces attended to.

Drop Off Area:

Prep to 2- outside of the canteen/ ticket booth.

Year 3- 6 - in the foyer of the theatre.

Please note that no child will be permitted to leave the theatre until a parent arrives to collect them and is ticked off on a roll. The collection points will be established and communicated at the end of the show by Mr Bull. Please be patient and respectful during this collection time, student safety is our priority.

General Information

Could each child please bring a quiet game, book or activity for when they are not required on stage. NO DEVICES ARE PERMITTED.

For security reasons no-one, including parents, is permitted in change rooms or tunnels at the theatre unless they are an official.

Children are not to bring any money to the theatre.

It is a requirement of the George Jenkins Theatre that no food or drink is to be brought into the theatre. Cameras, videos or mobile phones are not to be used inside the theatre and no children may be seated on knees.

We know that you and your children will enjoy being part of our school production and thank you for your assistance and cooperation. See you at the show!
