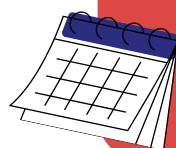
Parent teacher interviews will be on **Tuesday the 23rd of June from 1pm-7pm.**

What is your favourite food/treat?

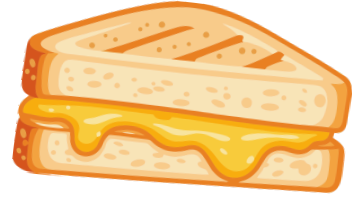
I love dumplings, but I also really like chocolate, that's my favourite treat!

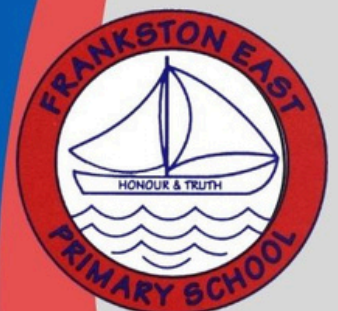

Book Week Breaky - TBC - Assist to cook/serve the sausage sizzle at the book week parade (approx 1 hour)

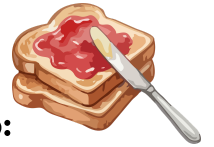
Fathers Day Stall - Thursday 3rd Sept - Help set up stall, help students with their purchases (approx 1 hour)

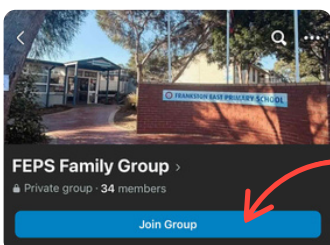
