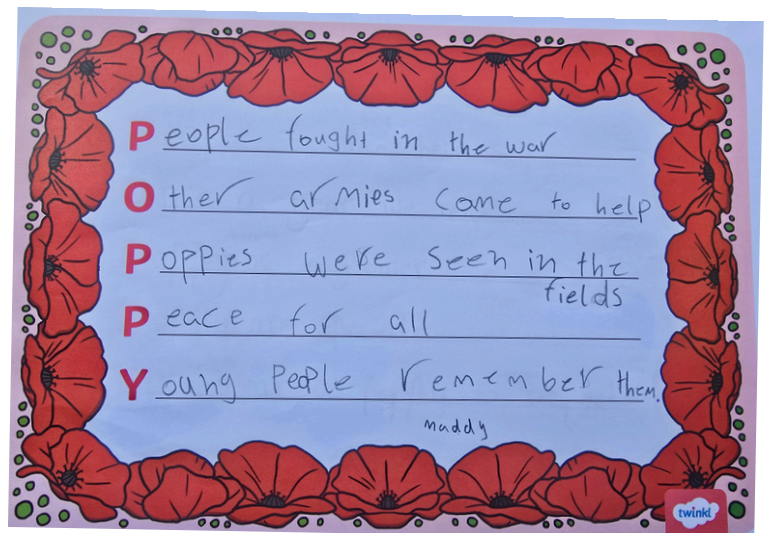
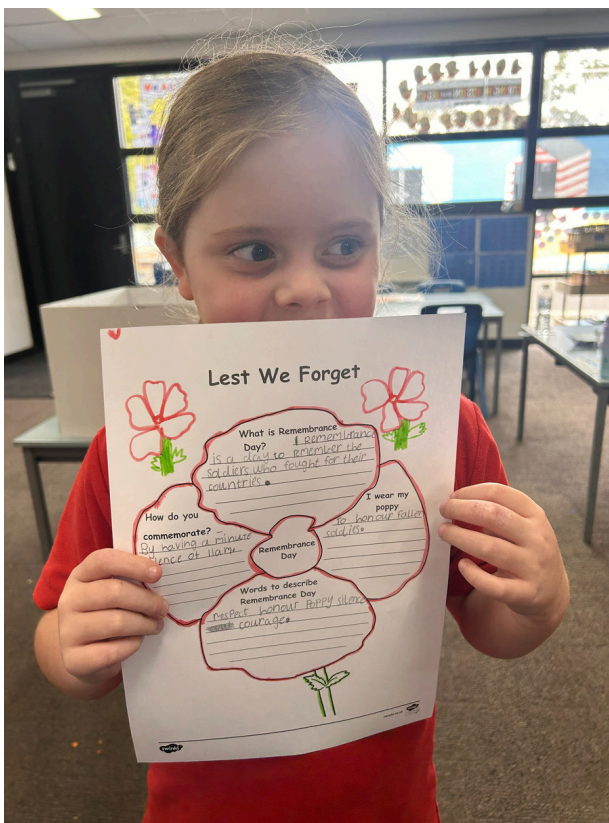
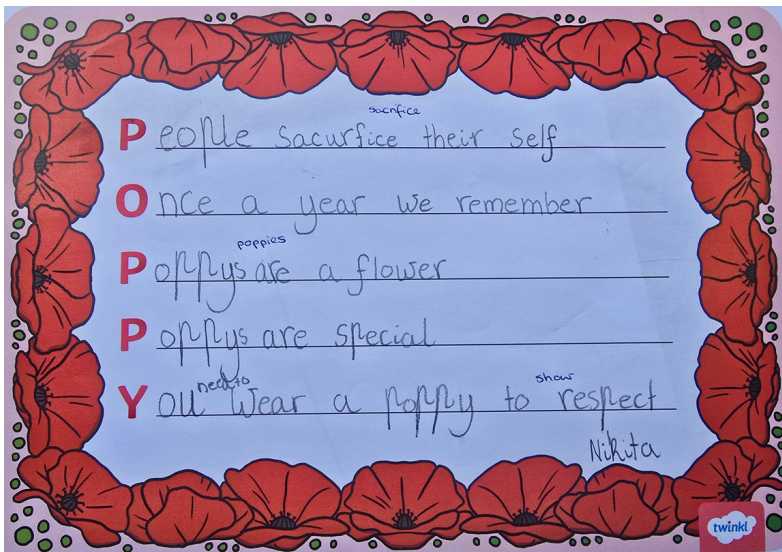
I strongly believe that children should not help cook at home. Helping cook is not fun, parents might let them choose and they might burn themselves. So don't help cook at home!
