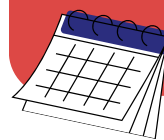

My advice is to have fun, be happy, and enjoy the little moments — life goes by fast.

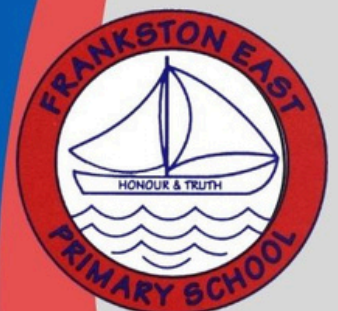

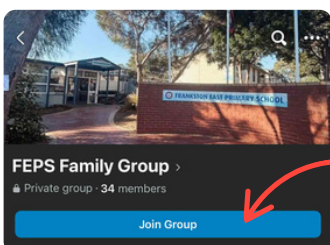
