There's lots of exciting events coming up in term 4, I've included the events calendar in this newsletter so you can pop it on the fridge!







SWIMMING PROGRAM 2025



Dear Parents,

Our annual Swimming program starts next week and will be held at the swimming complex PARC in Frankston. The cost of the swimming lessons will be \$72.50, and the cost of the bus will be \$25.00 per student. Due to the importance of every student having access to swimming lessons, our school will be **SUBSIDISING THE COST OF THE LESSONS AT \$72.50 PER STUDENT**. Families are asked to pay the cost of the bus at \$25.00 per student. Please contact the office to see if you have any Camp, Sport, Excursion Fund (CSEF) money to allocate to this expense.

The date for the Swimming Program for 2025 is from Monday October 20th to Friday October 24th.

Our children will be travelling to and from the pool by bus to participate in five intensive lessons. Each session will be 45 minutes. As swimming is an important life skill it is hoped that all children will attend.

Swimming Program Details

The cost of the swimming program of five lessons is:

\$72.50 for the swimming lessons (paid by the school)

\$25.00 for the bus to and from the venue (paid by the families)

Check with the office to see if you have any School Savings Bonus or CSEF money to cover the bus cost.



A permission slip was sent home with each student. Permission slips are now due back. If you did not receive a permission slip, please visit the office and grab a new one.



My favourite part of camp was the first night's dinner, which was BBQ Chicken, Mac n Cheese with a side of salad - **Samuel, grade 6**


My favourite part of camp was going to the top of the giant swing and feeling the breeze. - **Jennifer, grade 5**

Prep-2 Insects and Minibeasts Incursion:

Last Wednesday, Prep-2 students had a visit from Santi, from Reptile Encounters. The students learned about the unique and fascinating creatures that make up the most abundant animal group in the world – the invertebrates – and how important they are in our environment. He showed a range of insects and minibeasts, including leaf and stick insects, burrowing cockroaches, centipedes, Stella the tarantula, Josh the scorpion, Kermit the frog, and even a frill-necked lizard! The students especially enjoyed touching and holding many of the animals.
