It is deeply rewarding to see this work translating into real and meaningful outcomes for our students.

There is no doubt that the FIFA World Cup has brought an incredible buzz of excitement to our country in recent weeks, with students and staff alike caught up in the spirit of the beautiful game. The energy has been infectious! I will say, I did try to come up with a joke about soccer, but I was worried it might get kicked out!

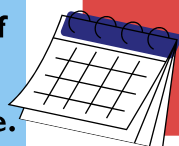

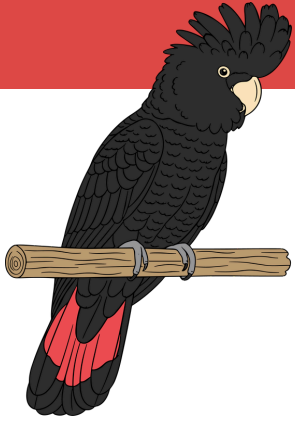

Reptile Encounters!

Last Friday our Prep to Grade 2 students experienced an amazing incursion from to have a visit from Reptile encounters.



Ben was our presenter and our students were introduced to many native animals that can be found in our local area around the Mornington Peninsula and Southern Victoria.

We met Romeo, a beautiful and very noisy red-tailed black cockatoo, Darwin the ring-tailed possum, a tiny sugar glider and we learnt all about stick insects and how they can camouflage themselves to look like sticks or dead leaves, to protect themselves from being eaten. Everyone enjoyed touching Bob, the Shingleback or Stumpy tailed lizard, Mo the Eastern Long-necked Turtle and rubbing the belly of a non-venomous Victorian Carpet Python called Sunday.

Everyone enjoyed seeing, touching and learning some interesting facts about these native animals. Did you know a stick insect can have about 1000 babies at a time? That is amazing!!

What is your favourite food/treat?

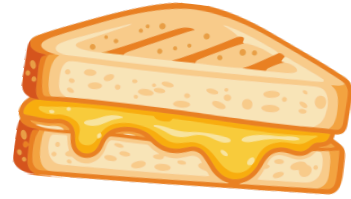
My favourite foods are tacos, pickles and chocolate. But definitely not at the same time!

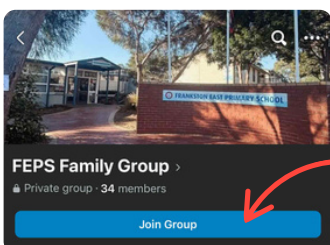


