Parents must bring their children to the theatre at 6:45pm.

The drop off areas are:

What to bring: If you could send your child with a quiet game, book or activity to keep them entertained while they're not required on stage that would be great! No devices are permitted. Children are also not to bring any money with them.

Please assist by leaving your children with their teacher at the drop off zone then taking your seats.

SWIMMING PROGRAM 2025



Dear Parents.

This year, our swimming program will once again be held at the swimming complex PARC in Frankston. The cost of the swimming lessons will be \$72.50, and the cost of the bus will be \$25.00 per student. Due to the importance of every student having access to swimming lessons, our school will be SUBSIDISING THE COST OF THE LESSONS AT \$72.50 PER STUDENT. Families are asked to pay the cost of the bus at \$25.00 per student. Please contact the office to see if you have any Camp. Sport. Excursion Fund (CSEF) money to allocate to this expense.

The date for the Swimming Program for 2025 is from Monday October 20th to Friday October 24th.

Our children will be travelling to and from the pool by bus to participate in five intensive lessons. Each session will be 45 minutes. As swimming is an important life skill it is hoped that all children will attend.




