



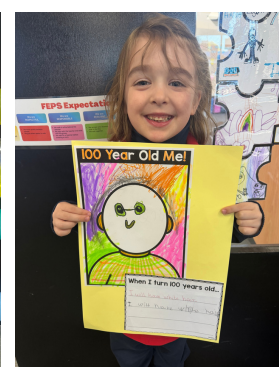
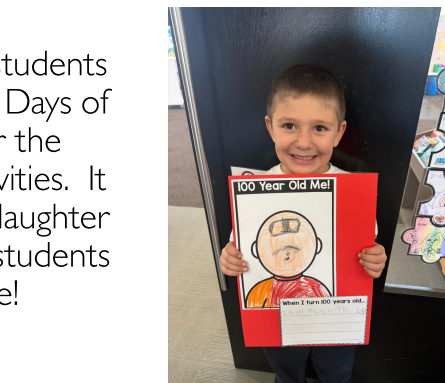

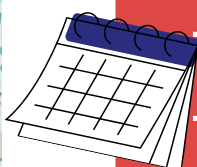

What is one piece of advice you can give to the students?

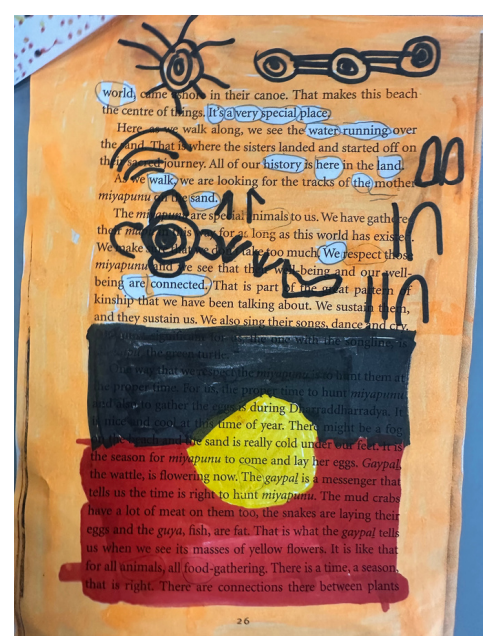
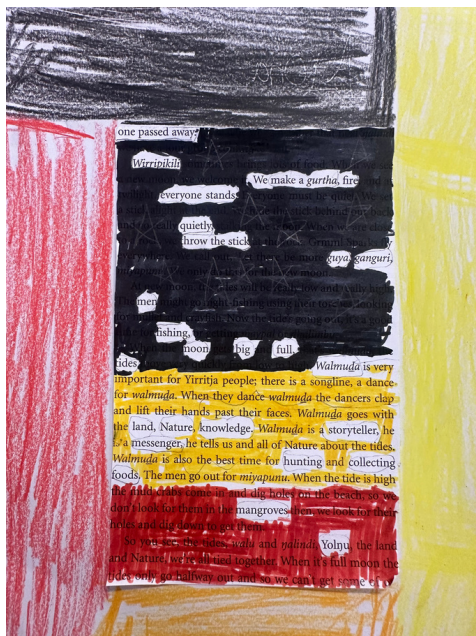
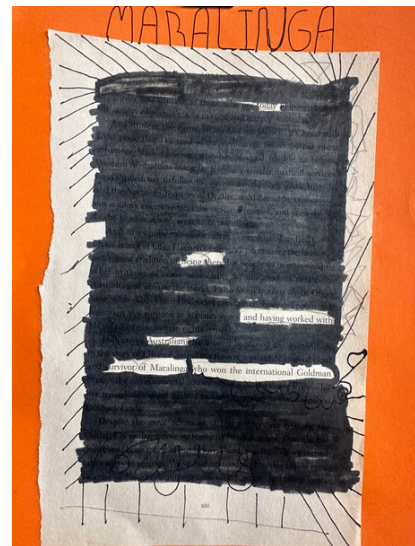
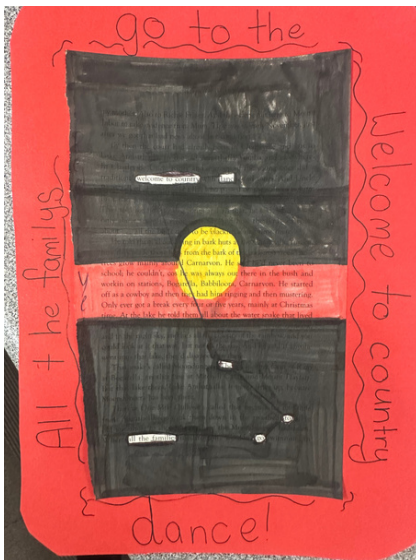
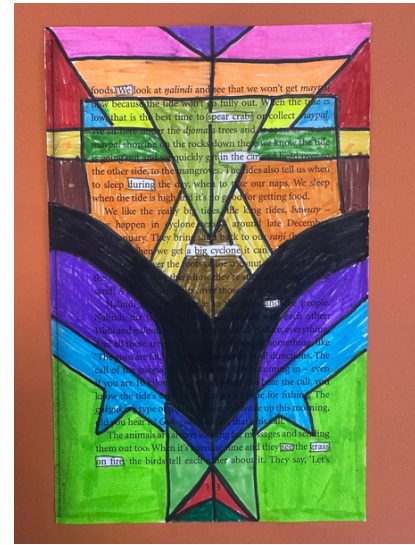

NAIDOC Week

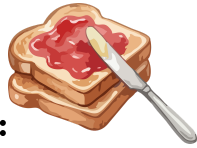

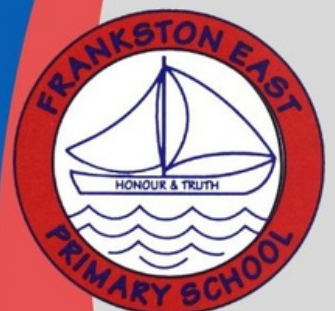

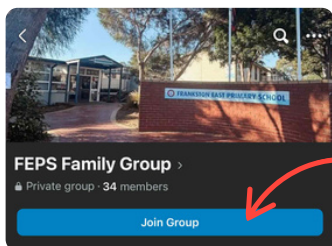
