Congratulations, Leo, on being our Aussie of the Month for June!

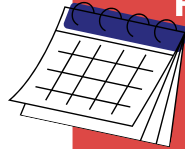

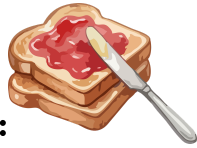

**Stay active every day. It's great for your physical health, your wellbeing, and it gives you a good excuse to get outside and have some fun.**

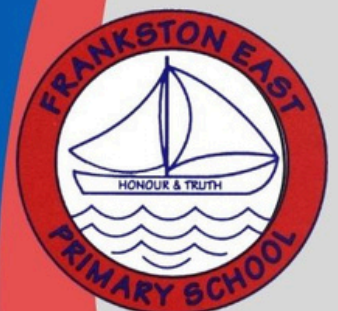

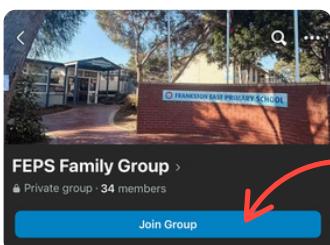
