**Be open to new things and challenges. You never know where they will take you.**

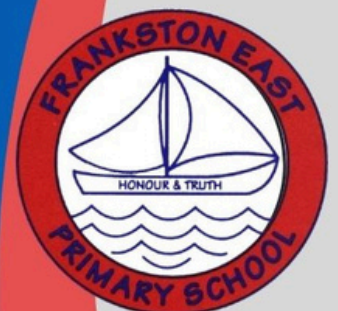

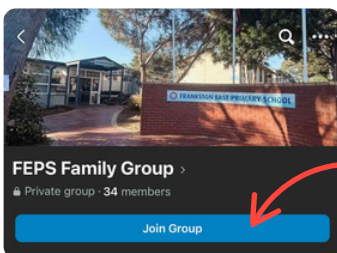
