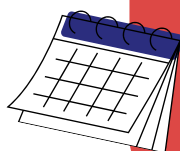
Book Week

Finally, a big shout-out to everyone getting into the spirit of Book Week. Wishing all our students and families a wonderful week of stories, imagination and dress-ups.

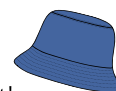

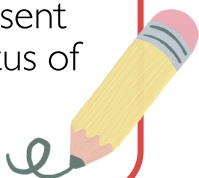

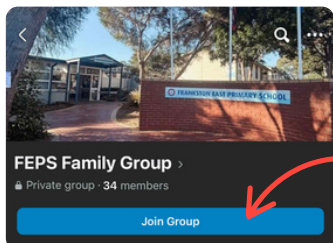
