Thank you, as always, for partnering with us to create a positive and productive learning environment for every child at FEPS.

And there's so much to look forward to! This Friday we have our Science Incursion, followed by a Curriculum Day on 18th August. 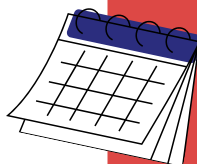

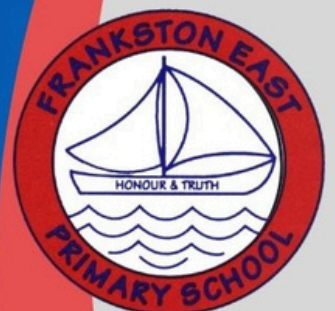

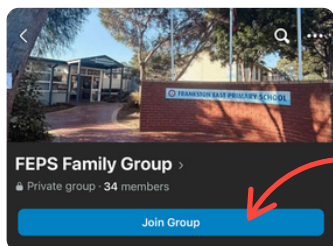
