




# LOCAL COMMUNITY NOTICEBOARD

## Safety improvements on Cranbourne Road and Beach Street



The Department of Transport and Planning will be installing a new signalised pedestrian crossing on the westbound lanes of Cranbourne Road near Beach Street in Frankston. The new crossing will link to the existing crossing on the eastbound lanes via a footpath in the centre median, improving access to schools, shops, bus stops and other local amenities. Please see the maps attached to see what we're doing and the location of the school speed zones.

### Access changes at Frawley Street

We're closing the right-hand turn from Frawley Street onto Cranbourne Road to make the intersection safer. The intersection has a history of crashes involving right turning traffic. The intersection has restricted visibility, and it can be difficult to find gaps between oncoming traffic on Cranbourne Road, particularly during peak periods. Motorists also have restricted visibility when stopped in the centre median opening due to vehicles queuing in the right turn lane on Cranbourne Road. The centre median opening is also too short for larger vehicles, such as trucks and buses, which can block eastbound traffic on Cranbourne Road while waiting to turn.

Alternate route to access the westbound lanes of Cranbourne Road

Drivers can turn left from Frawley Street onto Cranbourne Road and then perform a U-turn at either the centre median opening near the Frankston RSL or at the U-turn opening near Coprosma Avenue.

### What's next

Works are expected to start on these important safety upgrades in early 2026. We'll keep you updated about dates and construction impacts closer to works starting.


